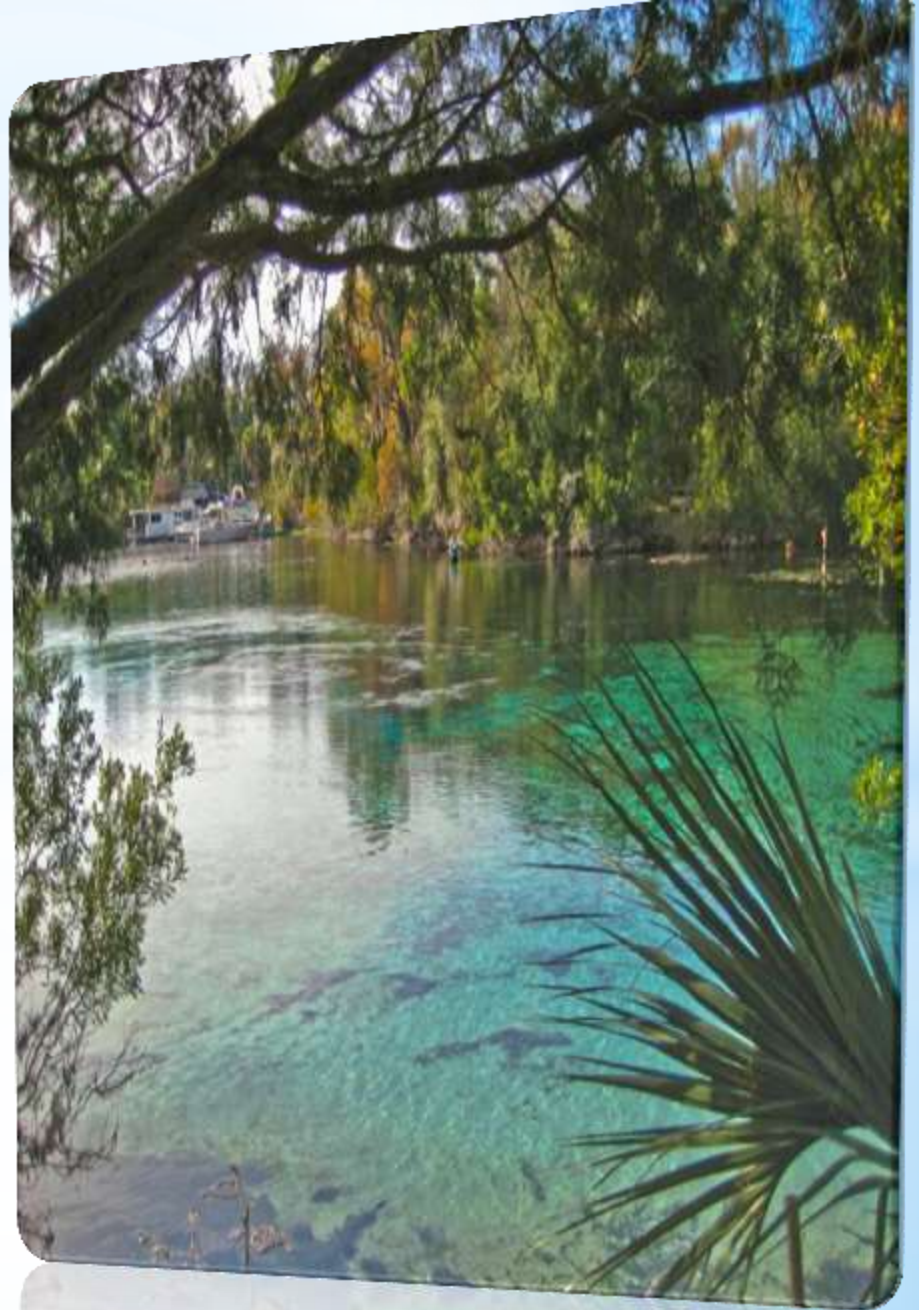

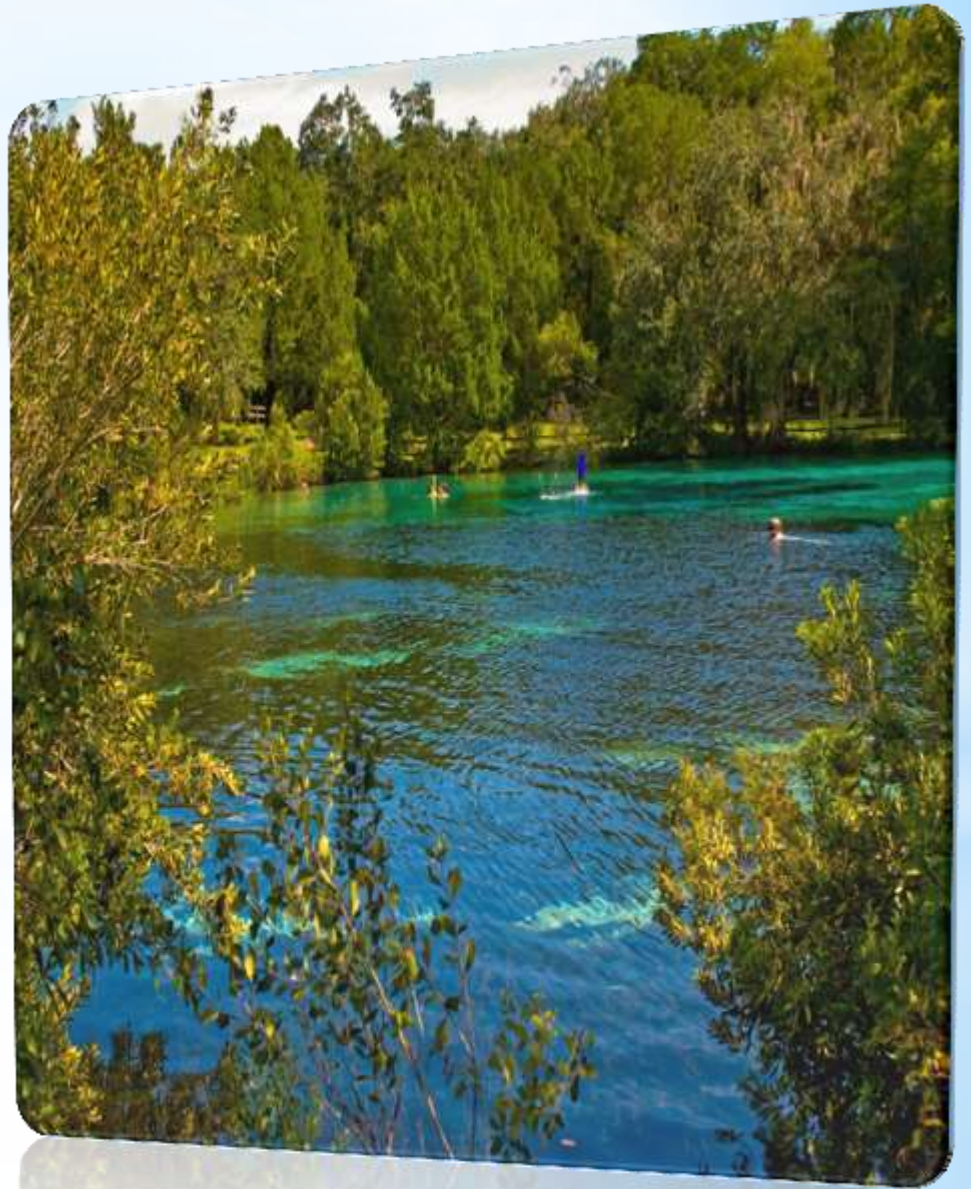

* PURPOSE



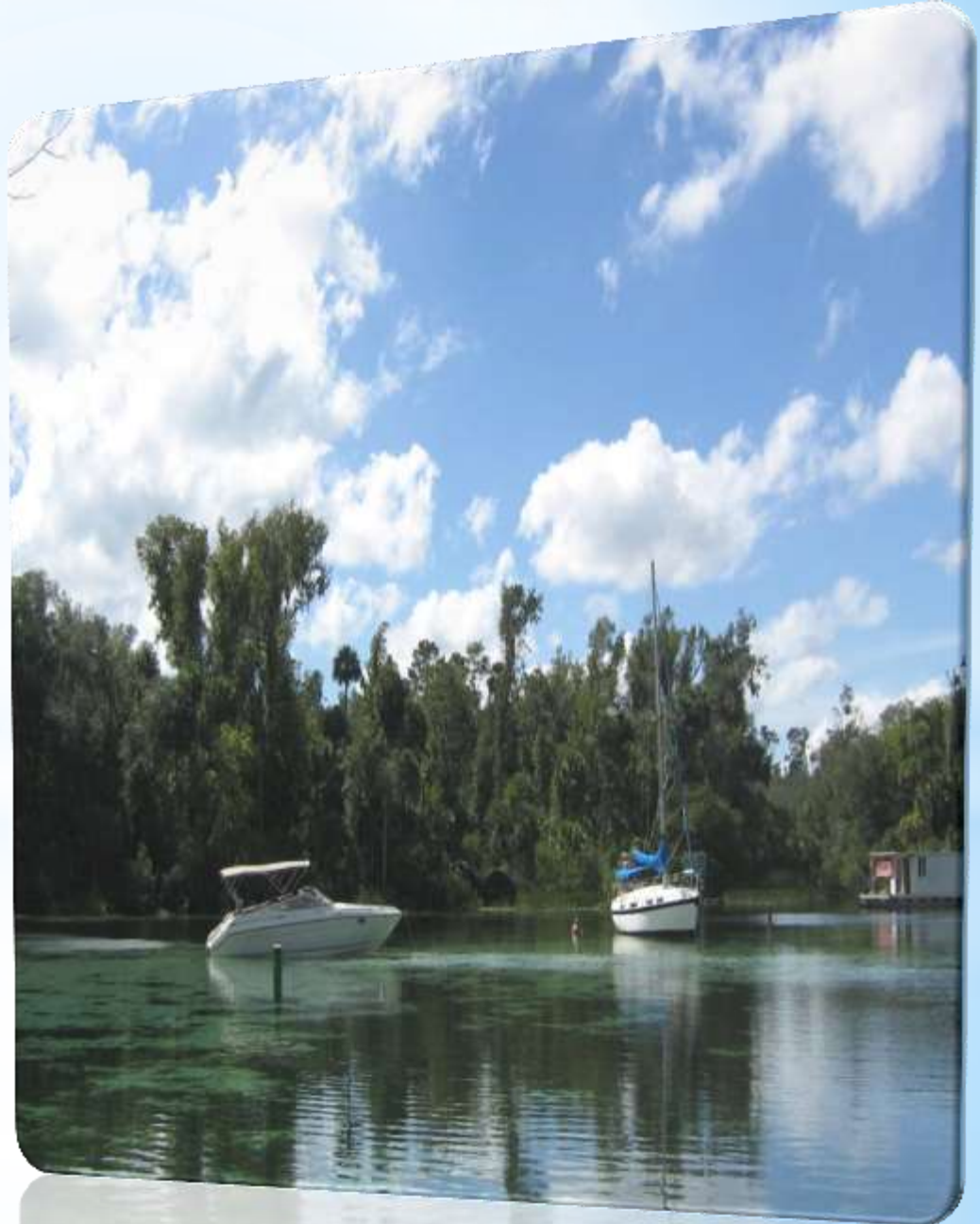
- * □ Engage diverse stakeholders in a transparent process that builds on areas of agreement and common values

- * □ Reduce the conflicts, fears and suspicions around management of Silver Glen Springs by serving as a bridge to broader constituencies

- * □ Address long-term boat storage in Silver Glen Springs
