- Energy Champs program started in 2011
- Recruit representatives from every Alachua County department
- Training on energy conservation and policies
- Champs were asked to work with their individual offices



Conservation Champs Objectives

- Promote conservation (add water)
- Lead by example (in-reach)
- Foster cooperation between County Departments



Stakeholders and Interests

<u>Environmental Protection Department-</u>Water Conservation in-reach, cooperation

Facilities Department - Reduce costs, meet reduction goals

<u>Sustainability Program</u>: meet program goals, gain momentum

Employees/Champs- Save money at work (jobs) and at home

Timeline

10/12- Individual meetings with stakeholders 11/12- Stakeholder meeting to introduce idea 12/12- Added to Energy Management Team 2/13- Survey completed by past participants 3/13- Design training event 4/13- Presentation to leadership 4/25/13 Training event!

Accomplishments

- Added to Facilities' Energy Team
- Survey Completed- 42% completion from past Energy Champs
- 20 out of 37 Conservation Champs recruited to date
- Buy-in from County Manager's Office
