Issue Summary

- ➤ To restore Jackson Blue Spring, multiple agencies provide cost-share funding to incentivize agricultural Best Management Practices (BMPs) that reduce nitrogen application and water use.
- ► Funding programs vary widely among agencies, but with areas of overlap. Through enhanced collaboration, these agencies could share information and experience, potentially leading to more effective program implementation and improved restoration outcomes.




