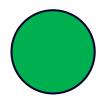

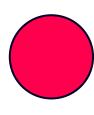


### NRLI Techniques



#### Poster boards

Collaborative Brainstorming Session that allowed participants to move around



#### **Process Agenda**

One process agenda to cover both evening sessions to ensure that we were connecting the topics and reiterating the learnings from the previous evening



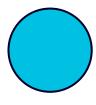
#### **Asking Prompting Questions**

Provided pre-work and post work questions to gage understanding and direct more networking amongst cadre and participants



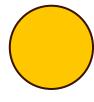
#### **Buzz Groups**

Utilized room noise to know when to move on to their next collaborative opportunity



#### **Building a Timeline**

Participants and cadre arrange themselves in a singular line based on their years experience. ConX 2025 had 420 years of experience in the same room.



#### **Feedback Session**

Daily After-Action Review (AAR) with cadre – what went well, what we could work on and knowledge to build upon Informal feedback opportunities offered throughout, and a formal survey sent after the event.

### **Takeaways**



	Outcomes	Lessoned Learned
Evening Session #1	<ul> <li>Participants worked in small groups with participants outside of the agency (pre-determined by ConX Team)</li> <li>Completed the management scale exercise the looks at developing prediction models</li> <li>Took a few rounds for participants to warm up to the game but they were catching on and applying in the field the next day</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Never assume (no projector)</li> <li>Work with cadre ahead of time to run through the game and different scenarios so everyone is versed in how the model works</li> <li>Tweak the activity to have more ConX based scenarios and add some addition pre-start learning before kicking off the game</li> </ul>
Evening Session #2	<ul> <li>Participants completed pre-work to set the base knowledge to expand</li> <li>Worked in different randomly selected small groups to problem solving natural resource management issues across agencies and leveraging additional expertise and</li> <li>Participants used information from the first 4 field trips to apply to their challenge</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Sending pre-work ahead of the event with only written instructions meant that we didn't hit more learning styles- should have been in orientation meeting</li> <li>Groups felt more engaged in this format- no technology barriers</li> </ul>
Meet n Greet & Logistics Online Meetings	<ul> <li>Set this for 20 days prior to the event for participants to meet and network with students and cadre ahead of the in-person ConX portion</li> <li>Icebreaker virtual breakout rooms and had participants share what their goal was to attend this event and a favorite natural resource management win for them</li> <li>Offered 1 "optional" office hour to address logistics questions ahead of the event- 1 week prior</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>We need to set the Meet n' Greet at least one month prior and share/walk through all the required pre-work so we can address different learning styles</li> <li>Offered more structure "optional office hours" x2 at different dates and times to accommodate more participant schedules</li> </ul>
